Academic Traditions

The Commencement Setting — The 2007 ceremonies marked the first graduations to take place in what is now known as the Deborah F. Stanley Arena and Convocation Hall within Marano Campus Center. Located in the heart of campus, the Marano Campus Center represents the university’s social hub and a gathering place for events appealing to a wide range of student, faculty and community interests. This \$25.5 million building was the first new construction on our lakeside campus in 35 years when it opened in the fall of 2006.

The Academic Procession — The centuries-old pageantry of the academic procession dates from ancient traditions rooted in the early universities. Since the clergy were in charge of the first academic ceremonies, they followed the familiar order of religious processions.

The Tradition of Academic Attire — Caps, gowns and hoods worn at college and university functions date from the Middle Ages. Monks and students of that time wore them to keep warm in the damp, drafty halls of learning. From these practical origins they have developed into the accepted garb which symbolizes scholarly achievement.

Baccalaureate gowns have a long, pleated front with shirring across the shoulders and back. They are primarily distinguished by flowing sleeves pointed at the fingertips. These gowns may be worn open or closed.

The master’s gown is worn open and the sleeve is cut so that the forearm comes through a slit just above the elbow. The lining of the hood is satin and the color represents the school conferring the degree. The velvet border color represents the discipline in which the degree was earned.

Doctoral gowns are traditionally worn open, but either open or closed is acceptable. They carry broad, velvet panels down the front and three velvet bars on the full, round sleeves. This velvet trimming may be either black or the color distinctive of the degree. Mortarboards or caps worn with baccalaureate and master’s gowns generally have black tassels. The tassel of the doctoral cap is usually made of gold bullion.

The doctoral hood gives color and meaning to the academic costume. Its silk lining bears the color of the institution conferring the degree. The hood is bordered with velvet of a prescribed width and color to indicate the field of learning to which the degree pertains.

Honor Cords for Military Service — United States veterans and reserve and active duty military graduating from SUNY Oswego are wearing red, white and blue honor cords in recognition of their service.

The University Medallion is worn by the SUNY Oswego officer in charge as a symbol of authority at all official ceremonies such as Commencement and Honors Convocation. Oswego is represented in the perfect center of the medallion by a tiny green and gold circle. The dot is located properly on an outline of New York state, which itself surmounts a globe to show the relationship of our institution to the state and the world. Fashioned by Dominic T. DiPasquale of the Art Department for president James Perdue’s 1966 inauguration, the medallion was a gift of the Class of 1966 for the occasion.

A wreath of gold leaves surrounds the globe and is circled by a flat band bearing the engraved university name and two dates: 1861, the university founding; and 1948, the founding of the State University of which Oswego was a charter unit. On the clasp above the medallion sits a gold lamp of knowledge, emblematic of a seat of learning. (Photo, page 1.)

The University Mace — In medieval times the mace was a weapon of offense with the metal head often heavily spiked. Today it appears chiefly in ceremonial functions of churches, governments, colleges and universities. The head of the Oswego mace holds a jade sphere symbolizing the university of wisdom and knowledge, surrounded by four silver flanges unfolding petal-like without imprisoning the sphere and representing the potential of disciplined imagination, the goal of higher education. The richness of the jade and the rosewood shaft reflect the pomp and solemnity of academic ceremony.

A gift of the Class of 1969 for President James Perdue’s inauguration, the Oswego mace has been in use at Commencement ever since. Joseph F. Shoenfelt of the art faculty created its design and silver work, with the rosewood turning by William D. Todd, formerly of the technology faculty. (Photo, page 35.)

Mary C. Toale

Officer in Charge

Toale is a first-generation, Pell recipient, former college student-athlete with more than 25 years of teaching, service and leadership in higher education. She is currently serving as the Officer in Charge after serving the university in various leadership roles since her arrival in 2014, and is a tenured member of the faculty.

She has been recognized for her excellence in teaching and service, and is an engaged member of her communities. She continues to lead and advance strategic initiatives in alignment with institutional priorities and was integral to the founding of, as well as securing funding for, the *James A. Triandiflou '88 Institute for Equity, Diversity, Inclusion, and Transformative Practice*. Toale has published and presented scholarly work, and is currently serving on committees focused on the region's preparation for Micron's investment in Central New York. She earned her doctoral degree in instructional communication and master's degree in communication theory and research from West Virginia University and a bachelor's degree, cum laude, in secondary mathematics education from West Virginia Wesleyan College.



Victoria Furlong

Vice President for Administration and Finance

Furlong earned her promotion to become Oswego's first woman to serve as vice president of administration and finance in September 2021. Furlong began her career at SUNY Oswego over 25 years ago and has had progressive leadership experiences on campus. In all of her positions, Furlong has sought to create a welcoming

and inclusive community for all. As SUNY Oswego's Chief Financial Officer, Furlong serves as a member of the President's Cabinet; oversees Facility Services, Human Resources, University Police, and the Finance and Budget Office. Furlong earned both her master of business administration and bachelor's in business administration from SUNY Oswego.



Mary Canale

Vice President for Development and Alumni Engagement

Canale came to Oswego in 1996 as the coordinator of the Oswego State Fall Classic, and successfully worked her way up to her current position as vice president for development and alumni engagement and executive director of the Oswego College Foundation — positions she has held since 2016. A 1981 alumna, Canale was integral to the success of both of the university's comprehensive fundraising

campaigns as well as the Path Forward, Possibility and Marano Scholars programs and the naming of the James A. Triandiflou Institute for Equity, Diversity and Transformative Practice in 2022. Canale serves as the university's principal fundraiser and has helped to achieve unprecedented growth in the school's endowment, which consistently shows stronger returns than peers. She is a member of the Association of Fundraising Professionals and the Council for Advancement and Support of Education.



Scott Furlong

Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs and Enrollment Management

The university's chief academic and enrollment officer, Furlong joined the Oswego family in July 2017. Furlong is responsible for leadership of all instructional and academic programs, overseeing more than 100 academic programs in the university's four schools with more than

550 faculty, as well as a range of academic support staff and offerings. In May 2022, he also added leadership for a holistic approach to enrollment management, admissions, financial aid and retention efforts. A renowned public policy scholar and co-author of two books, Furlong has led and championed efforts around student success, integrating the ideals of a liberal arts education into all curriculum, and facilitating activities that bridge curricular and co-curricular learning. He earned his bachelor of arts degree in government from St. Lawrence University, and his master of public administration and Ph.D. in political science from American University.



Kathleen Kerr

Vice President for Student Affairs

As Oswego's senior student affairs officer, Kerr serves on the President's Cabinet; oversees Auxiliary Services, Student Engagement and Leadership, Campus Events and Conference Services, Counseling Services, Health Services, Intercollegiate Athletics, Residence Life and Housing, the Office of the Dean of Students, Accessibility

Resources, Campus Recreation, Student Orientation and Family Engagement, and the Office of Student Conduct; to develop a strategic vision for student affairs while strengthening cross-campus collaborations. Her team strives to advance student success, complement and supplement the learning that occurs inside the classroom, and help engender student belongingness. She earned a doctorate of education in educational leadership from the University of Delaware; and both a master's degree in college student personnel administration and bachelor's degree in psychology from Indiana University.



Kendra Cadogan

Chief Diversity and Inclusion Officer

Cadogan, who joined SUNY Oswego in January 2022, leads the implementation of SUNY Oswego's strategic diversity and inclusion goals; serves as the interim director of the James A. Triandiflou '88 Institute for Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and Transformative Practice; and contributes to continued cultivation, enhancement and promotion of an

environment of equity and inclusion for all at SUNY Oswego. Cadogan previously served as the Senior Associate for Program and Policy Evaluation at the State University of New York. In this system administration role, she provided system-wide leadership for best practices related to recruiting and retaining diverse students through scholarship and fellowships initiatives. Cadogan also served as the Director of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion at the University at Buffalo School of Law, where she developed a broad range of DEI-related programs and initiatives. She earned her master of education and bachelor of arts degrees in psychology and sociology from the University at Buffalo.

Dean, College of Liberal Arts and Sciences

Croyle joined SUNY Oswego in 2019 as Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (CLAS). She is proud to oversee the exceptional faculty, staff and students across 18 departments and almost 50 majors in CLAS as well as CSTEP (the Collegiate Science and Technology Entry Program). She is committed to student success and fostering programs and supporting faculty who contribute to the achievement of SUNY Oswego students. Croyle's prior positions include vice president for student success at the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley and vice provost for undergraduate education and dean of the University College at the University of Texas-Pan American. She received her doctor of philosophy and master of arts in clinical psychology from the University of Montana, and a bachelor of science in psychology from the University of Utah.

Dean, Graduate Studies

Eichhorn was appointed dean in 2017 after serving the institution in several leadership roles, including Presidential Faculty Fellow, interim dean of extended learning, SUNY Faculty Senator and communication studies chair. Eichhorn was an American Council On Education Fellow in 2016-17, spending a year in Cornell University's Office of Provost. Eichhorn has a distinguished record of teaching and research and her publications include co-authoring the "Interpersonal Communication: Building Rewarding Relationships" textbook and research papers in multiple international journals. She earned her bachelor's degree from Canisius College, master's from West Virginia University and Ph.D. in communication from the University of Miami.



Jennifer Knapp

Dean, School of Communication, Media and the Arts

Named dean in March 2023 after serving as interim dean and associate dean, Knapp has significant administrative and teaching experience since joining Oswego in 2008. As associate dean, she was at the forefront of the rollout of the new Academic Probation policy, and helped train advisors while working directly with students. She has also been the point person for new adjunct orientation, organizing participants from across campus and building professional relationships. She also chaired the Assessment Advisory Committee for five years, chaired the Communication Studies Department and was twice interim department chair of Theatre. Knapp is proud to have led a team in the development of the new higher education leadership master's program. She earned her Ed.D. in educational psychology and master's in communication studies from West Virginia University and a bachelor's in communication studies from Canisius College.

Assuming the role as dean in July 2019, Kothandaraman previously served as chair and professor of professional sales in the Cotsakos College of Business at William Paterson University, and executive director of the Russ Berrie Institute for Professional Sales. Kothandaraman previously taught at Drexel, Texas A&M and Xavier Institute of Management in Bhubaneswar, India. He received his doctorate in business administration from Pennsylvania State University's Smeal College of Business, an MBA from the Xavier Institute of Management and a B.E. in chemical engineering from the Birla Institute of Technology and Science in India.

Before joining Oswego in January 2014, Pippin served for eight years as dean for continuing education at Jefferson Community College. Her career has spanned both academic and business positions such as director for graduate services and enrollment, adjunct business instructor, director of operations and major accounts manager. Experience in these roles and as an adult student, earning an MBA from Franklin University, has instilled a passion for providing access to higher education at all levels of the educational ecosystem. Previously, the Oswego alumna with a bachelor's in communication studies led enrollment management and student services for graduate students at Franklin University, developed the Jefferson Higher Education Center, facilitated significant growth of Jefferson's military services on Fort Drum and established other innovative and community-oriented programs for adult and non-traditional students. Dr. Juhanna Rogers
*Senior Vice President of Racial Equity and Social Impact,
CenterState CEO*

Rogers is a member of CenterState CEO's Corporate Leadership Team and serves as senior vice president of Racial and Equity and Social Impact. In this role, she develops and deploys diversity, equity and inclusion strategies that achieve more equitable outcomes both internally and across the organization's portfolios of work, including helping members and institutions establish strategic action-oriented plans that drive inclusive change in their respective workplaces.

Previously, she served as vice president of Racial Equity and Social Impact, and also director of community engagement and empowerment, developing engagement strategies to drive change in Syracuse. Before working at CenterState CEO, Rogers was the director for Health Services at Syracuse Community Connections. She also has a background in higher education.

Rogers earned her undergraduate degree in integrative arts from Penn State University-Altoona, and a master of science from Indiana University in higher education and student affairs. While completing her doctoral program in 2016, she and seven of her colleagues were deemed "The Great 8" and were recognized as the largest number of Black women to complete doctorate degree requirements simultaneously. The Great 8 were selected as Ebony Magazine Power 100 Honorees for being changemakers in education.

Rogers is a motivational speaker, commentator, artist and activist committed to social justice, education and the arts. As a critical race scholar, she builds platforms for critical conversations on race, justice and equity. Rogers has worked nationally and internationally to help address equity in higher education, exploring ways through which underrepresented populations can improve their lives and communities. She is also the creator of "Behind the Woman," a WCNY television production that shares personal stories from diverse women leaders to empower other women to pursue their goals and dreams.



Hon. Billy Barlow
Mayor, City of Oswego, New York

Mayor Billy Barlow first got involved in government at the age of 22, running for a seat on city council, receiving 70 percent of the vote and taking office in January 2014. One year later, Barlow announced his candidacy for mayor of Oswego in 2015, at the age of 24, and took office in January 2016 as the youngest sitting mayor in the state of New York and the youngest mayor in the history of Oswego. In 2019, he was re-elected as mayor and sworn into his second term in January of 2020.

During Barlow's tenure, he effectively worked with several partners to infuse over \$100 million in public and private investment over seven years to revitalize downtown Oswego, managed \$20 million in projects to further develop the waterfront, created an innovative and aggressive code enforcement program to restore historic neighborhoods, led the community through the COVID-19 pandemic, and much more, while overhauling city government and lowering property taxes and fees for city residents.

In addition to serving as mayor, he serves as the vice president of system development and public affairs for Oswego Health, a healthcare system based in Oswego serving all of Oswego County.

In his spare time, Barlow co-owns and operates Barlow's Concessions, a three-generation family-run food-concession business open at fairs, festivals and sporting events throughout the state of New York, state of Arizona and Las Vegas. Barlow graduated from Oswego High School in 2008 and attended college at Arizona State University, where he received a bachelor of science degree in environmental technology management in 2012.



Dr. Robert Simmons

*Head of Social Impact and STEM Programs,
Micron Technology and the Micron Foundation*

Simmons leads all social impact philanthropy in North America and STEM programming in North America for Micron Technology and the Micron Foundation. As a noted scholar on issues of racial equity, STEM and nonprofit leadership, Simmons also serves as a Scholar in Residence and Scholar of Antiracist Praxis at the School of Education at American University where he continues his research in the education policy and leadership department. As a member of the Diversity Scholars Network at the National Center for Institutional Diversity at the University of Michigan, his research for the last 15 years has focused on racial equity, STEM education and the lived realities of historically marginalized communities across multiple K-12 contexts. More specifically, he explores the experiences of Black students and teachers, equity in STEM and the lived experiences of Black fathers.

The founding director of the Center for Innovation in Urban Education at Loyola University, Simmons was one of the first African American men to become a tenured associate professor of science education and urban education, with a joint appointment in African/African American Studies, and served as a Research Associate at the Baltimore Education Research Consortium at Johns Hopkins University. Simmons has authored over 50 publications, focusing on race and racial justice, as well as equity, diversity and inclusion; including “Talking About Race,” a highly acclaimed edited collection of essays. His next book will focus on the experience of Black STEM teachers and Black fathers’ love for their sons identified on the autism spectrum.

A former middle school science teacher in the Detroit Public Schools with a doctorate in education, Simmons was nominated twice as the Walt Disney National Teacher of the Year and once for the Whitney and Elizabeth MacMillan Foundation Outstanding Educator Award. As a fellow with the Woodrow Wilson Fellowship Foundation and the Fulbright Memorial Fund, he traveled to Costa Rica and Japan to study educational systems and conduct environmental research in the rainforest. Selected for the Outstanding Alumni Award from the College of Education and Human Development at Western Michigan University and the BE Modern Man Award from Black Enterprise, Simmons has dedicated over 20 years of his professional life to supporting urban youth, their families and the community.

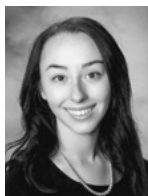
Thomas Ehrhard '24

A leader in education and an advocate of free public schools, Edward Austin Sheldon was responsible for opening the Oswego Primary Teachers' Training School. Sheldon's pioneering ideas in object teaching became a model for other normal schools throughout the nation and around the world. Sculptor John Frances Brines designed the statue that was constructed with penny contributions from school children throughout the state in 1899.
