- 2.Click on the "Student Records" tab
- 3.Click on "Apply for Graduation" and complete the required Information, follow the on-screen instructions
- 4.Meet with your major/minor advisor(s) to complete your senior checklist

Deadlines to File for Graduation for UNDERGRADUATE Students: Graduating August 2024

- File online before February 1, 2024
- Return Senior Checklist: April 1, 2024

Graduating December 2024

- File online before April 1, 2024
- Return Senior Checklist: May 1, 2024
- * Declare all majors/minors prior to applying for graduation
- * Must complete senior checklist to be eligible to graduate
- * August graduates participate in the May graduation ceremony; no special permission needed

Deans' List and President's List

Full-time degree students completing 12 credit hours of letter grade course work qualify for the fall and spring semester Deans' Lists by earning a semester GPA between 3.30 and 3.79. Students earning a semester GPA of 3.80 or above are honored by having their names placed on the President's List

- A student who has fewer than 12 credit hours of grades computed in the grade point average for any semester is not eligible for the President's List or the Deans' List honors.
- The following grades are not computed in the grade point average: S-Satisfactory, U-Unsatisfactory, P-Passing, F-Failure, H-High Honors, I-Incomplete, W, Withdrawn, WN-Withdrawn No Grade, WP Withdrawn Passing, WF –Withdrawn Failing, IP In Progress, Z-Instructor did not submit a grade, audited courses and repeated courses where a grade of C- or better was previously earned.
- This may impact Adolescence Education, Childhood Education and TESOL majors during semesters when taking a field placement and during the student teaching semester, as these experiences are graded: S-Satisfactory, U-Unsatisfactory, and H-High Honors.



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Required Workshops for Teacher Certification

Safe Schools, Healthy Students (SSHS 1020)

SSHS 1020 is an online workshop administered through the Division of Extended Learning, and fulfills the New York State workshop requirement for those completing a teacher preparation program through a college. Topics include: Child Abuse Recognition and Reporting; School Violence Prevention and Intervention (SAVE); Fire and Arson Prevention; Highway Safety and Traffic Regulations and School Safety Patrols; Prevention of Child Abduction; Prevention of Alcohol, Tobacco and Drug Abuse. Student Teaching Advisement Reminder:

All cognate courses must be completed with a grade of C- or higher prior to student teaching. Cognate courses include:

Childhood: PSY 100, HDV 322, Foreign Language, Gen Ed Computer Literacy course or competency exam, MAT 106, MAT 206, Natural Science with a lab, SSHS 1020, DASA 1020.

Adolescence: PSY 100, HDV 323, Foreign Language, Gen Ed Computer Literacy course or competency exam, SSHS 1020, DASA 1020.

TESOL: PSY 100; HDV 322 or HDV 323, or PSY 320; Foreign Language, Gen Ed Computer Literacy course or competency exam, SSHS 1020, DASA

Updated Mandated Reporter Training Requirements

Social Services Law § 413 has been amended to require additional training within the New York State Mandated Identification and Reporting of Child Abuse and Maltreatment/Neglect coursework to include protocols to reduce implicit bias in decision-making processes, strategies for identifying adverse childhood experiences, and guidelines to assist in recognizing signs of abuse or maltreatment while interacting virtually. The law requires that all mandated reporters, including classroom teachers, educational administrators, and pupil personnel service providers, complete the updated training curriculum by April 1, 2025. For information about approved training providers, please see the Office of Teaching Initiatives website. Additionally, the Office of Children and Family Services has created a <u>2-hour web-based self-directed online training course</u> that can be completed to satisfy this updated requirement.
