RE: Deactivating Art History Track with the B.A. Studio Art Degree

— MEMO —

During the 2021-2022 academic year, Art and Design decided to deactivate the Art History track within the B.A. Studio Art Degree. This decision was endorsed by the National Association of Schools of Art and Design during our re-accreditation process. The primary reason for such a move is that the program does not draw enough majors* to sustain the rigor such a program demands. Support of this program creates resource inequities within the department at the expense of B.F.A. programs, which average over 120+ majors.

While the department is asking to deactivate this degree track, we intend to keep the Art History area within our department. This area is essential in all the department's majors and is vital to our B.F.A. program and our ability to retain our accreditation.

In terms of student interest, the department intends to keep its Art History minor. The minor is very popular among students in department majors as well as others from outside the department.

* Art History has averaged two majors per year for the past five years, with only 3 degrees awarded during that same time period.

DEACTIVATION PROCESS

In preparing this deactivation proposal, the department is unsure how to proceed. The reason for this is that the Art History track within the B.A. Art degree was never formally approved by SUNY and is not listed as a study option by SUNY. I am unsure of when this degree track came into existence. As far as I can tell, no formal paperwork is needed to deactivate the program in terms of SUNY permission.

DEGREE REVISION

Given we intend to remove the Art History track from the B.A. Art degree, we may need to submit "Form 3A — Program Revision Proposal: Changes to an Existing Program." It is unclear how to proceed, given we never made a formal request to revise the degree to include this track. However, we did reference the Art History track in our proposal to add a track in Interaction Design (2020), which was a temporary step, before pulling that track out as a stand-alone degree (2021). Because of this confusion, we have prepared our proposal following Form 3A format to ensure we have covered all requirements should they be needed.

We do not expect changes to impact cost.

The primary reason for eliminating the Art History emphasis is that it does not draw enough majors* to sustain the rigor such a program demands. For example, Art History has averaged only two majors per year for the past five years, with only 3 degrees awarded during that same time period.

While the department is asking to deactivate this degree track, we intend to keep the Art History area within our department. This area is essential in all the department's degree programs (B.A., B.F.A. M.A., and M.A.T.), which are well enrolled. In addition, the study of Art History is especially vital to our B.F.A. and M.A. degrees retaining accreditation with the National Association of Schools of Art and Design (NASAD).
