





Action Steps:

Ongoing planning in place for 2023-24 to address the deficit with current levels of spending and budget control measures such as position review, discretionary spending review, and improving operational efficiencies.



SUNY Oswego 2024-2025 Budget Overview

4/1/24 – NYS Approved Budget Highlights

OPERATIONAL

- \$114m additional operational support (\$54m + \$60m additional).
- Continuation of \$163m investment from 2023-24.
- Fully support Employee Benefit Costs and Debt Service Costs for capital investment.
- Continuation of Tap Gap Support, including additional \$5.1m to increase minimum income thresholds.
- Continuation of \$53m to support new faculty lines in highneed areas (SUNY Oswego received \$460k for 4 lines).

- Reappropriation of remaining funds from the \$75m Transformation Innovation Fund.
- Restoration of EOP funding, including an additional \$.6m support.
- Restoration of a variety of U-Wide Programs/Initiatives.

CAPITAL

- \$550m Critical Maintenance
- \$160m for Building Enhancements & New Construction
- \$100m for Cash Funded Capital for Academic Programs



2024-25 SUNY Oswego Timeline and Assumptions

- Work on Revenue Projections May
- Submit Budget Plan June/July
- Assume enrollment stays flat (inclusive of recruitment and retention) represents 72% of our operational budget
- Expected increase in State Tax Dollar Support (add'l \$114M)
- No State-imposed Budget Cuts/Reductions





- Received approval for a 5-year Association for Advancing Quality in Educator Preparation (AAQEP) accreditation for our School of Education.
- Received approx. \$7.5 million in research grants.
- US News and Fortune rankings continue to recognize SUNY Oswego online MBA program as the #1 among programs offered by New York state public universities.
- Successful Solar Eclipse events were held on campus, featuring lectures from industry experts. A total of 1,079 viewers reserved tickets to attend and view the Solar Eclipse.

Oswego AI Pioneering Activities



SUNY Oswego will offer a "Chat GPT for Business" class during its summer session. It is one of the first emerging classes focused on AI business relations.

When Mohammad Tajvarpour first heard about ChatGPT, an artificial intelligence chatbot from the company OpenAI, he knew he had to move quickly. As an assistant professor of marketing at SUNY Oswego, Tajvarpour knew this product was something his students would encounter in their real-world experiences. He said the class is a matter of preparing students for today's workforce.

Facilities Update

A. Hewitt Hall Renovations

- The renovation of Hewitt Hall is an \$80 million project, capping off over \$124 million in renovations (Tyler Hall renovations were \$44 million) for the School of Communication, Media and the Arts (SCMA).
- Hewitt will be the new home for the departments of Communication Studies and Cinema and Screen Studies, and the Graphic Design, Interaction Design, and Illustration academic programs within the Department of Art and Design.
- Highlights include two broadcasting studios, a podcasting studio, a newsroom, a white box gallery, a film screening room, an animation lab, a virtual reality suite, a ballroom that serves as both a music performance space, and numerous specialized labs and classrooms.
- Project set to be completed in Fall 2025.
